## **AMARAN**

India | 2024 Tamil | 169' | Colour Amaran is a Tamil biographical drama directed by Rajkumar Periasamy portraying the remarkable life of Major Mukund Varadarajan, an Indian Army officer acclaimed for his exceptional bravery in Kashmir. The film traces his evolution from a sincere college student to a committed soldier of the Rashtriya Rifles, capturing the discipline, resilience and sense of duty that defined his service. It also explores his touching relationship with Indhu, a Malayali-Christian woman whose steadfast presence adds emotional depth to his journey. As Mukund faces the intensifying challenges of insurgency, the narrative highlights his ability to balance professional responsibilities with personal devotion, embodying

courage and compassion in equal measure. His heroic leadership during counter-insurgency operations culminates in the 2014 encounter that claims his life. Indhu later receives the Ashoka Chakra on his behalf, immortalising his sacrifice. The film stands as a tribute to Mukund's valour, integrity and enduring legacy of service and love.





## Mosquitoes (Le Bambine)

Mosquitoes (Le Bambine) is a 2025 Italian-language drama directed and written by Valentina Bertani and Nicole Bertani. The film presents a tender, intimate coming-of-age narrative set in 1997. The story follows 8-year-old Linda, who moves from her affluent grandmother's Swiss home to Italy with her free-spirited mother, Eva. In this new environment, Linda forms a deep bond with sisters Azzurra and Marta, creating a close-knit trio that seeks freedom, imagination, and escape from their emotionally complicated surroundings.

The girls grow up amid self-absorbed babysitter yearning for acceptance, all of which shape their understanding of belonging and identity. As they move between the fragile space of childhood dreams and the harsher realities of the Golden Leopard.

adult world, their summer becomes a tapestry of mischief, discovery, and emotional awakening. The film sensitively portrays how children interpret the complexities of family dynamics, social expectations, and personal struggles through their own innocent yet perceptive lens.






uzaffar Ali's Classics 'Umrao Jaan' and 'Gaman' dazzle IFFI 2025 By Mohammad 🚣 Aqib Khan Panaji, Goa: The 56th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) is currently celebrating the powerful duality of Muzaffar Ali's cinematic vision with special screenings of his restored classics, 'Umrao Jaan' and 'Gaman'. While 'Umrao Jaan' dazzled the Maquinez Palace with its story of a celebrated but tragic Lucknow courtesan, 'Gaman' offered a stark, moving counterpoint at INOX Porvorim, portraying the dashed hopes and urban alienation of a migrant taxi driver in Mumbai. The dual showcase reminds audiences of Ali's unparalleled ability to capture the complex sorrow of both high-society outcasts and the socio-economically marginalized. Both films continue to resonate deeply, confirming their status as vital, timeless commentaries on Indian life. The festival spotlighted the contrasting yet equally poignant narratives in Ali's filmography.'Gaman' was showcased at INOX Porvorim, captivating the audience with its unflinching look at the human cost of migration. The 1978 classic tells the story of Ghulam Hasan, a poor The screening underscored the film's enduring relevance to today's socio-economic issues. Following this, the opulent tragedy of 'Umrao Jaan' graced the historic Maquinez Palace-I. The restored version of the 1981 masterpiece — chronicling the life of a courtesan whose artistry is matched only by her heartbreak and status as a societal outcast — drew a spellbound audience. The film's exploration of identity, love, and a woman's autonomy in a patriarchal society cemented its place as a timeless piece of Indian cinema. Muzaffar Ali's dual presentation at IFFI 2025 serves as a powerful reminder of his mastery in capturing both the gritty reality of marginalized life and the sophisticated sorrow of high art.
